STATEMENT on the jihadist attack in northeastern Nigeria

The African Parliamentary Union,

- Dismayed by the jihadist attack of November 28, 2020, in a paddy field located at less than ten kilometers from Maiduguri, the capital of Borno State, in northeast Nigeria, causing more than 110 deaths and several wounded people,
 - 1. *Condemns* with the greatest firmness this cowardly and vile murder of brave workers caught in their fields;
 - 2. *Expresses* its solidarity with the Nigerian people in the face of the scourge of jihadist terrorism which hinders development and undermines social cohesion;
 - 3. Reiterates its condemnation of terrorism in all its forms;
 - 4. *Extends* its deepest condolences to the bereaved families affected by this attack, to the Parliament, people and authorities of Nigeria, and wishes for a speedy recovery to the injured people.
